

Water Production Superintendent

Must possess a high school diploma (or equivalent) two year technical degree preferred, and minimum of ten years' experience (preferably with two years supervisory level experience) with water treatment processes and regulations as well as daily water treatment plant operations. Must possess and maintain "A" level water operator's certificate with a minimum of six years of experience. This position performs responsible skilled and supervisory work ensuring the proper and effective operation of a water treatment plant and constructed well fields. Plans, organizes schedules, assigns, trains, counsel and evaluate the work of assigned staff and coordinate with operations and maintenance personnel as well as outside contractors. Ensures proper safety standards and precautions are followed; establish and implement effective safety training. Develops, implements, reviews and trains appropriate staff on standard operating procedures for the operation of the water treatment plant, wells and well field, pumping stations, reservoirs and towers. Reviews and analyzes laboratory data, record data in logs and data sheets, and read and record plant treatment flow rates and totalizer. Inspects processes and equipment, ensuring proper working order. Review operation logs and equipment failure reports. Orders parts, chemicals, and equipment for operations; order uniforms and safety equipment. Oversees operation and maintenance of chlorine equipment and implement the Chlorine Risk Management Plan. Must maintain a valid driver's license. **Respond to emergency or unusual problems after hours.
